



## **SITE: BEDGROVE SURGERY**

### **HOW TO GET YOUR TEST RESULTS.**

#### **The System**

Patients can call Bedgrove Surgery after 10.00am to obtain their test results. We will only contact you ourselves if your result needs any further action.

**Blood test results** are normally received after 5-7 days; however certain blood tests, for example, glandular fever may take longer. Your GP will be able to advise you on how long a test will normally take to come back during your consultation.

**Urine tests** are first dipped by a practice nurse at the surgery. The test will only then be sent to the hospital if the dipstick is not negative. The results are normally back 5 -10 days later.

**Swabs, toe nail clippings, skin scrapings and stool sample** results can take up to 4 weeks, this allows time to grow any bacteria present. In some circumstances this can take up to 6 weeks.

**Helicobacter results** are normally available within 7 – 10 days.

**Spirometry, 24 hour blood pressure and ECG test** results are normally available within 5 7 days.

**Cervical Smear results** will be sent directly to the patient in writing by Thames Valley Primary Care Agency within 14 days of the smear test being taken. If the results are inconclusive or abnormal the letter will detail what will happen next.

#### **Scan and X-ray results.**

If you have your scan taken at the Cressex Diagnostic Centre, to enable the Doctor sufficient time to review your scan and record the results in your medical record, please call the surgery 4 days after the scan for your result.

Scans and x-rays performed at Stoke Mandeville Hospital and other hospitals can take up to two weeks to come back to the surgery.

## **Why we have the system**

A wide variety of tests are carried out on our patients both in the surgery and in other healthcare organisations. Different tests require different diagnostic procedures and therefore take varying lengths of time to come back to us.

It is important that where possible the Doctor who instigated the test interprets your results in order to plan your care accordingly.

## **How it will help you**

We hope this leaflet helps patients to understand the system we have in place for obtaining test results taken at Bedgrove Surgery.

It is also important for patients to understand why some test results take longer than others to help alleviate their concerns or fears.
